25m / 20yds Lightweight Sport Rifle Individual League entry form Winter 26/27

Entries are invited for the LSRA Sport Rifle individual league.
The competition is open to all members of LSRA affiliated clubs.

Conditions

1. NSRA rules will apply unless otherwise stated.
2. **Firing position:** Standing, from the shoulder, unsupported.
3. To be shot on PL14-18 or PL14/06-18 targets at **20yds** or PL19-18 at **25m**.
4. All rifles must comply with the “**Lincolnshire Specification**” and conform to the “**Any Sights**” rule.
Full specification is on attached sheet.
5. All cards for a particular round must be shot on the same day.
6. This competition is Local Scored. Please make sure your club has access to NSRA registered scorers.
7. The organisers reserve the right to re-classify any shooter if required.
8. Scoring will be using the MacRae system with a rolling average.

Averages Please note!

Anyone who competed in one of the competitions from summer 2019 does not need to supply an average, it will be calculated for you from the latest available scores.

Only new entrants have to supply an average from certified, witnessed & retained trial cards (best 6 of 8 ex 200 to 1 decimal place) or other competition (please state).

The size of divisions will depend on number of entries. To facilitate accurate scoring some divisions may be asked to shoot 5 shots per card.

LINCOLNSHIRE SPECIFICATION

FOR LIGHTWEIGHT SPORT RIFLE

Rifles must meet the following specification:-

Bolt action, Semi auto or Underlever rifles in .22 Rim Fire Short, Long or Long Rifle.

(.22 WMR and .17 HMR are Not permitted)

Air rifles in .177 OR .22 calibre.

Airgun projectiles 5.6 mm (.22 in) or less, of any profile.

FAC Air Rifles MAX Calibre .22 May be used if range construction allows.

Magazines:-

When used with a magazine, the rifle shall not be loaded with more than 10 cartridges or projectiles, even though the magazine may be of a larger capacity;

Butt Plate:-

A basic vertically adjustable butt plate will be allowed. Multi adjustable butt plates are NOT allowed. Butt Hooks are prohibited.

Rifle :-

The stock may be adjustable for length;

The cheekpiece may be adjustable;

The fore-end. Adjustments and additions are permissible up to 150 mm from bore centre within the profile of the stock. Simple shaping to aid grip is permissible but this must not be anatomical, i.e. they must not be shaped to closely conform to the contours of the hand;

Sights :-

Any Sights "Open", "Aperture", "Metallic", Red Dot or Scope.

Laser sights strictly prohibited

Maximum weight :-

4.5kg (including sights and glove if used)

Trigger weight :-

There is no minimum trigger weight restriction but it is the responsibility of the shooter to make sure that it is safe. The RCO has the authority to rule that a trigger is unsafe if he believes it to be so;

The use of a sling or any other specialised accessory is prohibited. A Shooting Glove may be used, but No Specialised shooting clothing to be worn, i.e. No shooting jackets, shooting trousers, or boots etc.

Definition of the Standing Position:-

The shooter must stand free with both feet on the firing point surface or on the ground cloth without any other support. The rifle must be held with both hands and the shoulder, the cheek and the part of the chest next to the right shoulder; however, the rifle must not be supported by the jacket or chest beyond the area of the right shoulder and right chest. The left upper arm and elbow may be supported on the chest or on the hip. A palm rest may be used.

(NB Where the rule refers to right-handed shooters, the reverse of the rule applies to left-handed shooters)
